"What We Wish People Knew: Baptism"

Likely, all of us have had conversations with other people on religious issues. In those conversations we have learned that there are broad disagreements on what the Bible teaches. And too, people often misrepresent what we believe about the Bible. So we want to take the next few weeks and think about a few things we wish people knew [understood] on certain topics. Let's begin with baptism—a very contested and emotional subject for many. Here is what we wish people knew:

Announcements

- Funeral Meals: It has long been a custom of North Hamilton to provide a meal for the family after a funeral. Monetary donations for the meats for this meal are appreciated and should be given to Ruth Ann Stewart.

- 1. Baptism is not a "Church of Christ" doctrine. There is no earthly head-quarters for the Lord's church. There is no group of men somewhere on earth determining the doctrine of the church. Our guide is the Bible and our citizenship is in heaven (Phil. 3:20). Even though we are autonomous as a congregation and have elders governing this local group of Christians (Acts 14:22-23), we believe and teach only those things already determined by God (Matt. 16:19).
- 2. Our belief, that baptism is for the remission of sins, is not our opinion. Issues that are clearly defined and essential to salvation are not opinions. These are things that God expects all people to understand, obey and teach in unity (1 Cor. 1:10). When God says that baptism is a condition for salvation (Mk. 16:16), this is what He means. There is not another interpretation.
- **3. Baptism is immersion in water.** This is actually what the word *baptize* means, to be immersed or plunged. It does not and never does mean, "sprinkling" or "pouring." And since water is the element (John 3:3-5; 3:23; Acts 8:36-38), then baptism is a burial in water (Rom. 6:3-4; Col. 2:12).
- **4.** Water does not save, but it is part of what God requires to save us. We do not believe that there is a magical power in water. We believe the power is in the blood of Christ. But in order to get to the blood of Jesus, a person must go through the water (1 Pet. 3:21). Baptism in water is a condition to the salvation offered by God.
- **5.** Baptism results in the remission of sins. This is oddly the greatest point of controversy in conversations, and yet so easily discerned from Scripture. Peter told the sinners on Pentecost to be baptized "for the remission of sins (Acts 2:38)." Baptism is an action leading us to forgiveness. In another passage, we are baptized so that we can walk in newness of life. In another, we are baptized to become disciples of Jesus. All this means that we are not saved prior to baptism. We are saved only when we contact the blood of Jesus by faith in baptism.

The reason we want people to understand this is because we desire for others to be saved (1 Tim. 2:4). The devil is a master manipulator, and he wants people to believe lies and cause them to be damned. Let's change this. Let's work hard to share truth with others and explain the will of God.
