<u>Anniversaries</u> None this Week But we are firmly convinced that what is recorded in the Bible is true. We believe the Red Sea was parted, and the Israelites walked through on dry land (Exo. 14). We believe Jesus miraculously fed the thousands (John 6). We believe He walked on water (Matt. 14) and raised Lazarus from the dead (John 11). We believe them all. And we can do this while at the same time denying the existence of so-called modern miracles. Miracles in the Bible were actions that suspended the laws of nature and produced a result not possible without the immediate and direct action of God (*e.g.*, Acts 3:1-11). There are undoubtedly many amazing things that happen today, but by definition are not miraculous.

**2. Miracles had a purpose.** There were not arbitrary actions of God. They were not designed to entertain people, like a magic trick. Instead, these events were designed as a way of confirming the message God was revealing. Jesus promised miracles to His disciples, including speaking in foreign languages they had never learned and healing the sick. Then they "went…everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word through the accompanying signs" (Mk. 16:17-20).

**3. Miracles have ceased.** The Bible could not be any clearer, that miraculous activity had a time limit. Paul wrote about the duration of miracles, saying that miracles "will cease" (1 Cor. 13:8). He then explained the terminal point, "but when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away" (1 Cor. 13:9-10). The coming perfect thing was the completion of the Bible. And when this was completed (Jude 3), then miracles ceased because their purpose was served.

**4. People cannot work miracles today.** Some may claim to work miracles, but they cannot. Only the apostles had the ability to pass along miraculous gifts to others (Acts 8:17). Those who received power from the apostles could perform any number of miraculous feats (1 Cor. 12:9-11), but could not give power to another. The apostles alone had this gift. And since the apostles are no longer on this earth, no one today has miraculous power.

These are a few things we wish people knew, because it would help point people back to the Bible as the all-sufficient guide to salvation. Everything recorded in it helps us establish saving faith in Jesus (John 20:30-31).
