The Lord's Supper I Cor. 11: 23 - 30

Introduction

- Lord's Supper is a very important act of worship.
- Also known as communion (1 Cor.10:16)
- The breaking of bread (Acts 2:42)
- Formerly known as "The Eucharist"
- Eucharist = Greek word meaning the giving of thanks.
- Derived from Matt. 26: 26 27

Introduction

- It is an important act that we should understand. Why?
- 1. Lest it be meaningless to us.
- 2. Let it be displeasing to God.
- 3. Lest it be harmful to us (1 Cor. 11:27)
- 4. Lest we not understand who we are in Christ Jesus.
- 5. Lest we mock what Christ has done for us.

The Meaning of the Lord's Supper

- 1. It is a Memorial (I Cor. 11: 23 25).
 - We eat the bread in memory of His body.
 - We drink the cup in memory of His blood.
 - We commemorate the death of Jesus.
 - We remember that His death made the New Covenant possible.
 - We remember who shed His blood for the remission of sins.

The Meaning of Lord's Supper

- 2. It is a Proclamation.
 - We proclaim faith in the truth of the Lord's death.
 - If we don't believe He died for our sins, why participate?
 - We proclaim our faith in the Lord's return.
 - It is to be done until He comes back!
 - It proclaims that we look forward, backward, and expectantly await His return.

The Meaning

- 3. It is a Communion.
 - It a fellowship/sharing in the blood of Christ.
 - It is a reinforcement of the blessings that are in Christ Jesus (1 John 7,9)
 - It a fellowship/sharing IN the body of Christ.
 - It also stresses the importance of our Fellowship TOGETHER!!!

How to Observe the Lord's Supper

- 1. It is to be done in Reverence.
 - It is be done in a "worthy manner" (I Cor. 11: 27)
 - Worthy = Describes how to take it, not who to take it.
 - We must respect what God has done for us.
 - We must reflect on how Jesus suffered for us.
 - We must reflect on the spiritual anguish and pain that Christ suffered.

How to Observe the Lord's Supper

- 2. It is to be done with Self-Examination.
 - Are we living in a way that shows we appreciate what Christ has done for us?
 - It is a private reflection b/w self and God!
 - Are we living for Jesus who died for us?
 - Are we misusing God's grace?
 - Are willfully sinning and guilty of:
 - Trampling the Son of God underfoot?
 - Insulting the Spirit of grace (Heb. 10:26-29)
 - Refusing to repent and crucifying Christ afresh?

How to Observe the Lord's Supper

- 3. It is to be done with other Christians.
 - The disciples came together (Acts 20:7).
 - We are to wait (tarry) for one another (I Cor. 11:33)
 - We are to partake together of that "one bread" in one body (I Cor. 10:17)
 - We not only commune with God, but with one another.

When to Observe the Lord's Supper

- 1. To be done weekly.
 - Acts 20:7
 - The church at Corinth was coming together consistently, but observing it wrongly (1 Cor. 11: 17 22)
 - To be done at the same time and on the same day collections are taken up (1 Cor. 16: 1,2)
 - It was a weekly observance in the N.T.
 - It was done on the first day of every week.

When to Observe the Lord's Supper

- Historical evidence:
 - The Didache (95 A.D.) indicates that Christians came together on the 1st day of the week.
 - Justin Martyr records Christians assembled on Sunday to break bread.
 - Early Christians/Historians such as Irenaeus,
 Clement of Alexandria, Origen, and Cyprian all confirm this fact as well.

Confirmation

- Religious Scholars throughout history confirm this same fact:
 - Thomas Scott, Presbyterian minister
 - A.C. Harvey, Episcopalian minister
 - P. Doddridge, Congregationalist minister
 - Augustus Neander, Historian

They all confirm that the early N.T. church observed the Lord's Supper on the first day of every week.

Consequences

- If not taken properly AND for the right reasons:
- One will be guilty of the body and blood of the Lord.
- One will drink judgment to himself.
- "For this cause, many are weak and sickly among you and many sleep (dead)."
- To make light of the Lord's Supper is to mock what Christ did on the cross for us!!!!

Conclusion

- The Lord's Supper is to be observed by Christians in the Lord's Body.
- It does not mean that we must live perfectly to observe it.
- It does mean that we are to be serious and sincere when partaking of it.
- It does mean that we will answer for it in judgment.
