Key Concepts

- The power to reshape society is not primarily through politics but by communicating and displaying the gospel to others.
- By being submissive to the government (even corrupt ones), Christians guard their witness before unbelievers.
- Christianity can thrive in any political climate because Jesus' kingdom is not of this world.
- More than just being gospel messengers, we must be gospel neighbors who demonstrate grace by loving people.

Explore the Text

- 1. God expects Christians to be subject to their governing authorities (v. 1). Do you find this easy or difficult to do? Why?
- 2. Why do you think Paul spends so much time (vv. 1-7) emphasizing that Christians should be in submission to government?
- 3. Love is a debt that we owe others that we can never pay off (v. 8). Why would Paul say that we owe a debt of love toward everyone we encounter?
- Echoing Jesus, Paul reminds us that the law is all about loving your neighbor as yourself (v. 9). In practical terms, what does this look like?

- 2. Describe a time when you have seen a powerful example of someone putting the gospel on display by their acts of sacrificial service of others.
