Key Concepts

- We must not have contempt for Christians who take a more restrictive approach toward a matter of opinion.
- We must not judge Christians who take a more permissive approach toward a matter of opinion.
- Christian liberty in matters of opinion must be protected in both directions: the freedom to partake and the freedom to abstain.
- We must be careful in the use of our freedoms and look out for each other's spiritual well-being.

Explore the Text

- 1. Paul says that the weak Christian is the one who takes a more conservative, restrictive approach in matters of opinion (14:2b). How does this challenge your understanding of one who is weak in their faith?
- 2. We seem to have a tendency to judge one another over matters of opinion (14:4). Why is that? What is the real issue behind such behavior?
- 3. Rather than simply exercising our freedoms, we must look out for those who are weak (15:1). When in your life have you decided not to exercise your freedom in Christ because you were concerned about another Christian's faith?
- 4. Freedom in Christ and unity of believers are both important concepts explored in this section. Would you ever be willing to abandon one for the sake of the other?

- 1. Do you tend to have more of a judgmental attitude toward abstainers or partakers?
- 2. What is a topic that you have strong convictions about that you are also willing to admit is a matter of opinion? How do you treat others who see the topic differently?
- 3. How might you exercise more grace toward Christians with whom you disagree?
- 4. Think of a Christian that you tend to pass judgment upon. How will you extend grace to that person this week?
