Key Concepts

- Although a Christian still sins, he/she is not condemned being justified by faith in Jesus.
- Christians face the daily struggle of living in two worlds: having a redeemed spirit and a yet-redeemed body.
- Jesus traded place (and faces) with us on the cross and he fully paid the consequence for the believer's sins.
- A person who walks by the Spirit has a life that is oriented toward spiritual matters.

Explore the Text

- 1. The Christian's basic struggle is between the willing and the doing (7:14-24). Describe a time in your life when you wanted to do something but seemed unable to do it. How did it make you feel?
- 2. In the very midst of our sin, God looks at the Christian and says no penalty for you (8:1). How can God not penalize the Christian for sin and have integrity?
- 3. God himself was able to accomplish for us what the law was unable to do (8:3-4). How did God fulfill the requirement of the law (that we be punished for our sin) and yet provide us forgiveness?
- 4. Salvation is provided for those who walk according to the Spirit rather than living for the flesh (8:4b). What does it mean to you to walk according to the Spirit?

- 1. Read Romans 7:21-24. How do you relate to what Paul describes here?
- 2. How might a deeper awareness of God's grace actually break the chains of sin in your life?
- 3. What changes in your life do you need to make that would help you have more of a spiritual mindset?
- 4. How does God's patience and grace toward you make you feel toward him?
