Key Concepts

- In Christ, God has fulfilled his promise to Abraham of using the ethnic nation of Israel to bless all nations.
- God can elect individuals to service without guaranteeing their personal salvation since salvation is always based on belief.
- The key to entering and remaining in God's grace is belief in Jesus Christ.
- It is not the lack of moral performance that condemns us; it is a lack of faith in Jesus.

Explore the Text

- 1. Paul explains that not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel (9:6). What do you think is the difference in being an ethnic Jew vs. being a spiritual Israelite?
- 2. God sometimes uses unbelievers for his service while justly condemning them because of their faithlessness (vessels of wrath, 9:22-23). What do you think is the difference in God electing someone for service and God electing someone for salvation?
- 3. Belief in Jesus is the key to salvation (10:9-13). What do you think it means to call upon the name of the Lord? In the full context of Romans, what all might that involve?
- 4. Continuing in belief is crucial for remaining connected to Christ and a person can be broken off from God because of unbelief (11:20-23). What do you think is the difference in believing in Jesus and trying to be saved by your moral performance record?

Transform Your Life

- 1. How have you tended to equate your service to God with your salvation?
- 2. What is the difference between believing something in your mind and believing it in your heart (cf. 10:9)?
- 3. When have you ever been jealous of someone who received something so easily while you worked so hard to obtain the same thing? How might this relate to grace?
- 4. In what areas in your life do you have the most difficulty allowing Jesus to be Lord?
