Divided Methodist Church

Last Friday (1/3/20), leaders from the United Methodist Church announced plans to split the denomination over the issue of homosexuality. This split is the result of a vote cast last summer in which delegates of the denomination from around the world voted 438-384 to ban same-sex marriage and same-sex clergy members. Most of the Methodist churches in the United States were opposed to this outcome and in favor of sanctioning homosexuality. Because their differences are irreconcilable, leaders of the denomination have resolved that the two sides will part ways and form separate denominations.

The problems in this story are deep and numerous. The following is a brief summary of them:

- In both testaments, the Bible clearly teaches God's opposition to homosexuality. In Romans 1:26-27, the practice is called degrading, unnatural, and indecent. In 1Timothy 1:10-11, it is described as "contrary to sound teaching, according to the glorious gospel of the blessed God." In 1Corinthians 6:9-11, we learn that homosexuals will not inherit the kingdom of God unless they repent ("such were some of you") and are washed, sanctified, and justified in Christ.
- From the beginning, marriage has been defined in God's word as the union of a man and a woman (Gen. 2:24). By the historical context of the woman's creation for the companionship of man in Genesis 2:18-23, marriage can never be redefined to be anything else regardless of the opinions of people. This is not merely a tradition of mankind, but rather it is the mandate of God, who is the one that joins a man and a woman in marriage according to Jesus Himself (Matt. 19:4-6).
- The beliefs, practices, and teachings of Christ's church are not to be determined by a vote of delegates at a convention. The true "church of the living God" is "the pillar and support of the truth" (1Tim. 3:15). That truth is found in God's word (John 17:17), not in the opinions of men or the will of any majority.
- The church designed and built by Jesus is not comprised of denominations, but rather it is one, unified body. He built His single church (Matt. 16:18) and died to purchase it with His own blood (Acts 20:28). "There is one body" (Eph. 4:4), and that body is the church (Eph. 1:22-23). Jesus Himself is the head of that body, and the body is subject to Him alone (Eph. 5:24). He adds individual souls to His church when they obey His gospel (Acts 2:41, 47). Those individuals organize, work, and assemble together in local congregations (Rom. 12:4-5; 1Cor. 12:27). Each local congregation is overseen by elders who are responsible only for the flock among them (Acts 14:23; 20:28; 1Pet. 5:1-5). Nowhere in this design, construction, and function of the church is there a place for denominations, conventions, or votes by

- delegates to determine the church's policy.
- There is no separate clergy class to be ordained within the church. Jesus designed His church so that members would have different roles (1Cor. 12:12-26; Eph. 4:11-13), but no one in the church is to be exalted above others. The only "Reverend" in the Lord's church is the Lord Himself.

The division within the Methodist denomination presents an opportunity for its members and all who claim to believe in Christ to think carefully about these issues. Anyone who belongs to a church that is founded, organized, and governed contrary to the teachings of Scripture should be leaving that church and looking for the true church of Christ. Indeed, such a person should be looking for the truth of God's word and examining himself to see whether he is following it. It is the Lord who should direct our steps, not conventions of denominations, popular culture, or the majority opinions of men.
