Truth is not a Democracy

Democracy means that the people rule. In a pure democracy, the preference of the majority of people always governs. Our nation is not a pure democracy, but rather it is a democratically elected republic. This means that voters choose their representatives in the government. Some specific issues are also settled by the people when they are put before the public for a direct vote. In those issues, the preference of the majority determines the outcome.

Truth is not a democracy. People are not the arbiters of what is true and what is false. Truth is not determined by popular vote, for it is not subject to the people's preferences or opinions. Truth is unchangeable and cannot be revised by a democratic process. Even if a vast majority wishes to change the truth, it cannot be done. For example, if one hundred percent of people voted to change the molecular structure of water from H_2O to CO_2 , water would remain unchanged.

Why then is it that some people behave as if the truth of God's word can be changed by a majority opinion? How foolish it is to attempt to oppose God with the strength of man, for "the weakness of God is stronger than men" (1Cor. 1:25). Regardless of how strong a majority may be or even if there is a perfect consensus of the people, it will never overpower the irresistible truth of God's word. God will always rule, and His word will always govern. He does not need us to give our advice or consent via a vote, for His ways and thoughts are higher than our ways and thoughts (Isa. 55:8-9). "Let God be found true, though every man be found a liar" (Rom. 3:4). Indeed, if every person says the opposite of truth, God still speaks only the truth. "If we are faithless, He remains faithful, for He cannot deny Himself" (2Tim. 2:13). Indeed, even if every person says that there is no God or that His word is false, He does not waver.

For this reason, it is foolish and dangerous to conform to majority opinions. It is a terrible fallacy to believe that the popularity of a belief is indicative of its correctness. Too often, the majority is wrong, and those who follow the majority will be wrong as well. For example, consider the days of Noah when "the LORD saw that the wickedness of man was great on the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually" (Gen. 6:5). In that time, "all flesh had corrupted their way upon the earth" (Gen. 6:12). However, there was one exception: Noah. Noah was perhaps the smallest minority that has ever been on earth, yet he did not allow the majority to determine his course. What if Noah had thought, "Surely, that many people cannot be wrong"? If he had done so, then we would not be here today.

Nevertheless, the efforts to change truth by swaying majority opinions continue unabated. The news media craft their stories to shape public opinion rather than to report truth. Likewise, leaders in popular culture via music, movies, television, and websites use their influence to change the minds of those who consume their products. Very often, these messages are contrary to the truth of God's word. For example, the homosexual agenda is advanced through these avenues like an invading army, but the truth about the matter remains unchanged. God's word says that homosexual behavior is degrading, unnatural, indecent, and contrary to sound teaching and the gospel (Rom. 1:26-27; 1Tim. 1:10-11). Regardless of how many people are persuaded to accept homosexuality as a normal, healthy, and moral behavior, it will never be so.

Therefore, let us be warned. Truth is not a democracy, and a majority opinion is not a safe indicator of truth. Too often, following the majority will lead us down the wrong path. Jesus instructed us to avoid the way of the majority in Matthew 7:13-14:

¹³"Enter through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the way is broad that leads to destruction, and there are many who enter through it. ¹⁴For the gate is small and the way is narrow that leads to life, and there are few who find it."

Let us be among the few who believe the truth, follow Jesus, and find eternal life. This way may not be popular in this world, but it is the only way to enter the kingdom of God.
