A YOUTUBE CHANNEL FOR BIBLEQUEST

Today is the day that a new YouTube channel is being launched. The *BibleQuest Practice* channel on YouTube is intended to be a place where people who are interested in BibleQuest can go to view videos, which are designed to inform viewers about the Bible knowledge bowl, itself, as well as to offer them teaching on the material that is due to be covered at the upcoming competition. The first video, which is being released to the public today, is simply *An Introduction to BibleQuest*, which is intended to offer a simple explanation of what BibleQuest is and who may benefit from it. Other videos like it will be released in the future, but this first video is offered as an experiment in recording, editing and uploading the other videos, which will come after it.

We will begin immediately to produce at least one fifteen to twenty minute video, per week, to cover each of the first fifty of the Psalms, which is going to be the theme of BibleQuest 2021. We hope to be able to present teaching on each of the Psalms, as well as several of the themes developed in the Psalms, through the medium of these short videos. It is also our aim to promote BibleQuest through this new YouTube channel—and you can help us with that. The next time you login to YouTube, search for “BibleQuest Practice” and subscribe to the channel. When you subscribe, click to bell icon and you will receive a notification whenever a new video is published. Share the videos we post to your Facebook page and other social media outlets, so that others will see them and perhaps subscribe to the channel themselves. It is through this kind of “word-of-mouth” advertising that we hope to spread the word about what we are doing with the BibleQuest program and hopefully inspire more young people to want to participate in the competition.

An Overview of the Book of Psalms



“Psalm” is from a Greek term, which means, “words that accompany the music.”

The book of Psalms is divided into five parts, called “books.”

Book 1 = Psalms 1-41 — Book 2 = Psalms 41-72 — Book 3 = Psalms 73-89 — Book 4 = Psalms 90-106 — Book 5 = Psalms 107-150

116 of the Psalms feature “superscriptions,” which offer information about the backgrounds of the Psalms.

According to the superscriptions, there were many writers who contributed to the book:

David wrote 73 Psalms — **Asaph** wrote 12 Psalms — the sons of **Korah** wrote 11 Psalms — **Solomon** wrote 2 Psalms — **Heman** the Ezrahite wrote Psalm 88 — **Ethan** the Ezrahite wrote Psalm 89 — **Moses** wrote Psalm 90 — 51 Psalms were written anonymously

Most of the Psalms are for the praise of God (Psa. 139).

Some of the Psalms are expressions of sorrow for sin and repentance (Psa. 51).

Some of the Psalms are cries for help from the Lord (Psa. 142).

Some of the Psalms are vehicles for Messianic prophecy (Psa. 16).

How many songs can you find in our songbook, which were inspired by the Psalms in the book of Psalms?
