Kyle's Korner

I've been pondering some thoughts surrounding Jesus' transfiguration on the mount. It was just as much an experience for Jesus as it was for His

disciples to see Him transfigured before them and speaking to Moses and Elijah. It is one of those places where Jesus is revealed to be none other than the Son of God.

Mark's account of this occurrence is found in chapter 9, the chapter from which I've been reading. Here we are told of Peter's felt need to say something in the moment. We know what he said, but why did he say it? Are we given a reason for him to say what he did? Mark's account, interestingly enough, provides a reason, saying in verse 6: "because he did not know what to say, for they were greatly afraid." The reply comes from the clouds (v. 7): "This is My beloved Son. Hear Him!"

Peter, when he didn't know what to say, felt like he needed to say something before truly recognizing Jesus' place in existence as the Son of God. Moses and Elijah had their place in history, no doubt, but the greatest lesson for Peter to learn is the importance of listening. For a man that spent much of his time with Christ talking, he needed to realize that there are times when talking just isn't necessary. There is, indeed, "A time to keep silence, And a time to speak" (Ecclesiastes 3:7, NKJV).

Do we ever try to speak for God before recognizing the facts? May we, like Peter, recognize the importance of listening to God's Word more often.
