

I have faced so many times in my life when I needed to pray, wanted to pray, but had no words to pray. Sometimes it was because the situation was completely overwhelming. Other times, I just wasn't sure what to ask God to do. Then there are the occasions that I spend my prayer time telling God what I think He should do, as if He needs my help. News flash...He doesn't!

While reading the Lord's prayer, I discovered a simple but powerful prayer. Just four words, but they say so much, "Thy will be done (Matthew 6:10)." That's it.
