#### **The Power Within**

In 1986, Red Sox Pitcher Roger Clemens had his first Major League at bat. Being a pitcher in the American League meant that you never had to actually swing a bat – the designated hitter took your place. But in the 1986 All Star game, they were playing by National League rules, so the pitchers would have to bat.

Clemens found himself, for the very first time, in a major league batter's box. He took a few shaky practice swings in the on-deck circle, and then, stepped into the batter's box to face the reigning Cy Young Award winning pitcher – Dwight Gooden. So Clemens, a pitcher who never batted would have to face the best pitcher in all of baseball.

You'll never believe what happened! Just kidding! Quite predictably, Roger Clemens struck out. He was shocked at the power of Gooden's pitches. He could hardly believe how they flashed across the plate in the blink of an eye. At one point during his short at bat, he turned to the catcher behind him, Gary Carter, and said – "Gary, is that what MY pitches look like?" Carter replied, "You bet it is!"

From that day on, he would tell people that the experience in the batter's box had a great influence on his own pitching. Once he understood the power of his own fastball, he pitched with all the confidence in the world.
