I read the following statement somewhere, I wrote it down, but I don't remember where I first read it. The statement was, "A man who does a little more than he is asked to do, who takes a little more care than he is expected to, who puts the small details on an equal footing with the more important ones, is the man who is going to make a success of his job. Each little thing done better is the thin end of the wedge into something bigger." The principle of success is the same in all things. If we are able to transfer our training from one field to another we can become a success at many things. A man or woman can be a success in business and a success in religion at the same time. Unfortunately, many people have never learned this valuable principle. For many, they think that in order to succeed in business they need to neglect religion. Then again, some think that to succeed in religion they are forced to neglect business. Nothing could be further from the truth in either scenario. It is often the inability we have to transfer knowledge from one field to another. The same diligent work, keeping up with details, working earnestly at even the smallest matter, that causes success in business also makes us succeed in the service of the Lord. That man or woman who has learned to be conservative in matters of finance, knows the value of looking after pennies. It is true that if we look after pennies, the dollars will look after themselves. That is an old quote attributed to Benjamin Franklin and it is true in other small and large matters as well.

Success does not come from complaining and grumbling. Israel lost their right to the Promised Land largely because they were a complaining,

murmuring, dissatisfied people. What was true of Israel is true of the people of God today. It is true in any work. If those who are doing the work are constantly complaining, you will usually find them doing this when they should be working. organization can succeed with workers who are always grumbling and complaining. When you find an organization disintegrating from within while all outward advantages point to the possibility of success, you will usually find complaining prominently displayed throughout that organization. However, if those connected with the organization are content with their lot, and are working harmoniously toward the well being of the business, they are on the sure road to success. This is also true in our church work.

Just as success does not come from complaining and grumbling, it also does not come from wishing and dreaming. There is nothing wrong with wishing, it just does not get us any place. If our wishes and our dreams can be made real through our work, then they are good. Otherwise they only serve to create unrest and dissatisfaction. 
