Oftentimes there is a heavy mood among people in our world. Recent events in our world, both overseas and in our own land have had a profound effect on folds. He tells them to go and make disciples of all nations. Yet, the way was apparently blocked by the opposition of the Romans. The antagonism of the Jewish church was also standing in the way. Then add to that the apathy of the people.

Look at that little group of men. What did they have with which to make an impact on the world? I am confident history would have treated them kindly had they given the whole enterprise up as a hopeless dream.

Have you ever wondered what motivated them to keep going? Why didn't they give in to the mood of futility that hangs so heavy on the souls of good men and women today? Well, the New Testament gives us the answer. They had a Master who fortified them against it. He would not allow them to give in to their fears. He would not allow them to fear the darkness. Jesus taught them to believe in the effectiveness of light.

Jesus told them, "Ye are the light of the world." He insisted that "a city set on a hill cannot be hid." As we have heard on many occasions, "It is better to light a candle than to curse the darkness." But that only leaves us bitter and depleted. We have the same Master those early disciples had to lead us. Jesus then as now believed in the effectiveness of candlelight. He told His friends to leave off cursing the darkness. He wanted them to spend their time lighting candles. That is what we need to be doing in our day and time. But naturally the question comes, how can we accomplish that?

We can pray. More than any other time in our life, prayer is needed now. We cannot do anything more important than pray. We can pray for our nation and its leaders, we can pray for those we love

and we can pray for the church. Remember the disciples asked Jesus to teach them to pray and that was the only thing they asked Him to teach them.

Our prayer must be Christian prayer. Some would say, "well, if we pray it will be Christian prayer because we are Christians". But, what do we mean by "Christian Prayer"? It is prayer consistent with the teachings of Jesus Christ. Let's be honest, some of our prayers are anything but Christian. Many of our prayers are "sub-Christian

<sup>6</sup>. They are prayers that our will might be done. Often they are presumptuous, impatient and arrogant. They are self-absorbed and selfconcerned.

As Christians, we need to pray the prayer of repentance. The Publican of Luke 18 set the example for this. As Christians we need to pray for our nation and we need to lead the nation to humble, heart-searching, life-changing repentance.

We need to pray the prayer of dedication to the will of God. Our prayer should be like that of Jesus in Gethsemane. Do you remember? Jesus prayer, "not my will but thine be done." Our prayers can be candles in the darkness if they are the expression of a passion to discover and co-operate with the will of God. Through prayer, we must surrender ourselves and become instruments in the Hand of God to accomplish His will.

Now, here is where it can become difficult. Our prayer should be for all men, not just those we love. Jesus tells us that we must pray for our enemies as well as our friends. We preach, teach, sing, pray and carry on the work of the church in the name of Jesus. Jesus tells us to love our enemies and pray for them. He set the example on the cross as he prayed for those who put Him there. Can we be true to Jesus and do less?

In our daily lives, we must exemplify Jesus. When others look at our life, what image of Jesus do they see? It is the way we conduct our commonplace lives that offers the greatest opportunity to make an impact for our faith. Jesus spent a lot of his ministry trying to show ordinary people how magnificently their simple lives could count. He commended the gift of the poor widow. He concerned himself with the man of one talent. He took notice of such simple deeds of compassion as the giving of a drink of water.

To light a candle in the darkness, we must be true to Jesus. Jesus tells us to let our lights shine.

The darkness is ominous and depressing. Yet, there is task to be done. A task that is waiting for you and for me. Light a Candle!
