Selling The Church

I was reading the other day about a man who went to see a preacher during the middle of the week, wanting to be baptized. He had become convinced that it was the right thing for him to do. Once he had learned and was convinced that was what he needed to do to be saved, he did not want to wait. When the preacher asked him what prompted this decision, the man quite frankly answered that his wife's family was primarily responsible for his decision. In fact, in talking with the preacher he used the expression, "they sold me on the idea". His wife had in fact told him that she did not want to influence him. He told her that whether she had wanted to or not, she had influenced him. What she really meant to say was that she wanted it to be entirely his decision, she did not want him to be baptized just for her or to satisfy or pacify her and he was fully aware of her meaning.

Did you notice that he said to the preacher, "they sold me on the idea"? Think about that statement. How many people have you sold on the idea of becoming a Christian? It is a given fact that we are selling folks one way or another every day with our lives. Christianity is something you either practice or you don't practice. There is no middle ground here. There is no way we can honestly say we are neither encouraging or discouraging others in the matter of becoming Christians. We are doing one or the other. Either our Christianity has not been outstanding enough to make an impression or we have made the wrong impression. Quite honestly, I cannot think of anything worse than being responsible for someone losing their soul. It is a positive tragedy when we invite someone to attend our services and they say, "well, I have known (blank) all of my life and I know they are a member of the church of Christ and knowing the kind of person he/she is I am not interested in their brand of Christianity." This is something that will apply to all of us. We are either selling people on the Lord's church or we are turning them against it.

All of us have opportunities every day to bring others to Jesus Christ by applying the principles of Christianity and the teachings of Jesus to our everyday lives. People we work with and people we come in contact with should not have to ask if we are Christians. They should know it by the way we conduct ourselves. It makes no difference what our work or recreation is, we are influencing those we come in contact with. We are either influencing them for Jesus or against Jesus. We are either influencing them in favor of the Church or against the Church.

This good woman and her family "sold" her husband on the Lord and His church. Other good wives have sold their husbands. Good men have sold their wives. However we want to phrase it or look at it, all of us are salesmen or saleswomen for Jesus Christ. Now, here is the question for all of us to answer within our own hearts. By my life, by my actions, by the way I conduct myself, am I selling folks on the importance of Jesus Christ and the church or am I selling folks on the fact that Jesus Christ and the church are meaningless?

Across The Preacher's Desk

One of the great themes of the New Testament is the concept of individual spiritual growth. When Paul wrote the letter to the church in Corinth, it was a congregation beset with problems. There was a party spirit and the church was divided into factions. In chapter 3 he tells them he cannot write unto them as being spiritual because they are carnal. They are still babies spiritually. They have been fed with milk and not with meat because they cannot handle meat.

The Hebrew Christians are told in chapter 5 that they have reached the point they should be teachers. Yet, they haven't grown and need someone to teach them the first principles again. He says they have need of milk and not of strong meat. They are babies.

Peter comes along in I Peter chapter 2 and tells his readers to lay aside malice, guile, hypocrisies, envy and evil speaking. Instead, they are to desire the sincere milk of the word that they might grow spiritually.

Yet, that was Peter's first letter. In the second letter, as he brings it to a close there is a further instruction on growth. In chapter 3 and verse 18 he writes, "go on growing in grace" (Moffat). Now think about those words. There are a lot of people who are born again but never seem to progress much further than infancy. The reason is, that they soon learn to be a "spiritual couch potato".

You see, growing in Christ means hard work, commitment and dedication. Are you up to the task?
