Jesus' Walks Made Friends

Mark chapter 1 tells us about Jesus taking a walk by the Sea of Galilee. He started out walking alone, he was looking for followers. He was looking for disciples and friends, and he found them. In verses 16 through 20 we read of four who were destined to be very close to Him.

While the Sea of Galilee saw many memorable happenings in the life of Jesus, none was more significant than the calling of these disciples. Simon, Andrew, James and John. It reminds me of the familiar words from John Greenleaf Whittier.

In simple trust like theirs who heard, Beside the Syrian sea. The gracious calling of the Lord, Let us, like them, without a word, Rise up and follow Thee.

Those familiar words come from a prayer song, "Dear Lord and Father of Mankind". Mark's account leads us to believe these first disciples were caught off guard and unprepared to hear the call of Jesus. However, John tells us three of the four had already met Jesus. They had been introduced to Him. Those gatherings on the bank brought about by John the Baptist had led to their meeting Jesus. John had even directed their attention to their future leader. When we sing the words of that familiar hymn: "In simple trust like theirs who heard", we know the simplicity lay in their faith. It was not in their following blindly one they did not know.

When Jesus told them to follow him, they went with him. They literally followed him about Galilee. They tried to follow his way of life. When they left their boats it was to go after Him. As they went they learned more of what this challenge meant. They were no longer able to spend their days on the lake. They were not able to just spend the day

catching fish. Now they spent their days on the dusty roads. They were in unfriendly towns. They were in strange countrysides and villages, learning the art of catching men.

On the blue waters of Galilee, these men had earned a living. They knew the hazards of storms and empty nets. They were familiar with the high tax on their catch. Yet, following Jesus they went into unknown dangers.

Yet, we see no hesitation on their part. They might not know where they were going to travel, but they did know who was leading the way. They answered the call of Jesus promptly and without hesitation.

Jesus invited them, he said "come ye after me". It gave them a choice. You see, Jesus does not coerce, he invites. We are told that straightway they left their nets to follow Jesus. That means right then, without reservation, gladly. Many times they would suffer and falter, but these four would never turn back.

These men recognized there was only one who could answer the age-old hunger of the human heart for God. And just as Jesus called these men to be his friends, he calls us. These men came face to face with Jesus. Like others who came face to face with Jesus, their lives were never the same. When you and I answer the call of Jesus, when we make Jesus the Lord and Master of our lives, then our lives will never be the same. We will live changed lives, we will live life, God's way.
