# The Walks of Jesus Lead To Faith

Luke chapter 5 tells the story of Jesus walking by the Sea of Galilee. The crowd pressed on him, wanting to hear the word of God. Jesus saw two ships nearby that were empty of men. The fishermen were washing their nets on the shore.

Jesus got into one of the ships, the one that belonged to Simon. He asked Simon to take the ship out from the land a bit. That way it would be easier for Jesus to teach the people. So we see Jesus using a boat for a pulpit. Teaching the people who had come to him.

When Jesus finished teaching he told Simon to launch into the deep and let down his net for a draught of fish. Luke tells us that Simon was not exactly thrilled with this idea. He told Jesus they had fished all night and caught nothing. Yet, he told Jesus that at his word he would do it.

So, Simon launched out into the deep and let down the nets. The catch was large enough to break the net. They called to their partners to come and help them. Luke tells us that both ships were filled with fish.

We are tempted to stop at many points in this story. Yet, the most vital message to us seems to be that simple challenge to "launch out into the deep". You see, too often we live in the shallows of our faith in God. We live in the shallows of Christianity. We are content to wade in the Kiddie Pool and take only a little of what God offers to us. Our hunger and our thirst is often deep. Yet, God's storehouse and God's well are without limit. God can supply more than we can ever need.

Launching out into the deep is a venture of faith. Reading between the lines, we see that Simon had no great expectations. He had tried and come back already with empty nets. He wanted to tell Jesus that if he would stick to preaching then Simon would stick to fishing.

Faith is something we could all use a larger dose of sometimes. In Luke 17:5-6, Jesus tells us the kind of faith to have. He tells us we should have the faith of the mustard seed. That was the smallest seed He could think of.

Our faith must be a faith in God for the Hebrew writer tells us in Hebrews 11:6 that it is impossible to please God without faith. However, our concept of the heart of God is often too small. We have faith in each other but our faith in God is small. We have faith in checks and banks. We have faith in automobiles and airplanes. We have faith in cooks we have never met and strangers who drive us in cabs and busses. When you think about it, it's a bit silly on our part. We have faith in people we do not know and have never met, yet we are reluctant to have faith in the God of heaven who created us.

A formal faith is worth nothing at all. It is actually worth less than nothing. It deludes and misleads. A formal faith is merely a mental assent to the fact that Jesus Christ lived.

A feeble faith will not accomplish great things for God either. It sinks in the hour of trial and it shrinks from open declaration and makes a feeble fight. A feeble faith begins the fight but abandons the enterprise.

God demands a living, appropriating faith. This kind of faith is the only effective faith. A faith that will launch out into the deep. This faith will accomplish great and wonderful things. This is the faith we must have.
