Finding Fault

"And when they saw some of his disciples eat bread with defiled, that is to say, with unwashed hands, they found fault" (Mark 7:2) Imagine that, the Pharisees found fault with followers of Jesus! Any student or even casual reader of the Bible is aware that the Pharisees were frequent critics of Jesus and of His disciples. Their criticism of Jesus was based primarily upon the dislike they had for him because his teachings were contrary to their own ideas and actions. In fact, the more Jesus taught, the more intense their dislike and the more severely they managed to find fault.

Let's be honest. Criticism can be a good think if it is the right kind of criticism. Yet, the criticism of the Pharisees was not what we would call "constructive criticism". Their criticism was not designed to help Jesus. The purpose of their criticism was to belittle him in the eyes of the people. It was also to escape the condemnation that they deserved because of their sinful conditions. It required very little ability or intellect to criticize in the way the Pharisees criticized. It is for this reason that very little if anything is gained by engaging in this kind of criticism. No one is helped, neither the one being criticized or the fault-finder who is doing the criticizing.

To be sure, we need to be aware of our faults. We do not need to be like the conceited man who said, "I think I would be able to see my faults, if I had any". Most people, when their faults are pointed out to them in a kind and loving manner with the right motives are ready to correct their faults. But, beware of that man or woman who finds fault with everyone but you whenever they are in your presence. That person will surely find fault with you when they are in the presence of someone else. In fact, a person like that is what is commonly referred to as a "chronic fault finder". It is rare for them to ever say much that is good about anyone and they usually spoil anything good they have to say by launching into a lengthy recitation of all the faults that they are aware of.

As Christians, finding fault with others should be kept at a minimum. If we honestly look for the good in others, most people have far more good characteristics than they do bad characteristics. Certainly, the bad characteristic in others should not be overly emphasized as they often are by the "chronic fault-finder". Finding fault with others as the Pharisees found fault with Jesus is sinful, there is simply no other word for it. Much of the faultfinding in our day and time is based upon incomplete information and incomplete knowledge of the person who is supposed to be at fault. Perhaps if the critic knew them better, they might discover that they were the one who was in the wrong, not the one they are criticizing.
