

MOSES, AN UNBELIEVER

"And Moses and Aaron gathered the congregation together before the rock, and he said unto them. Hear now, ye rebels; must we fetch you water out of this rock? And Moses lifted up his hand and with his rod he smote the rock twice; and the water came out abundantly, and the congregation drank, and their beasts also. And the Lord spake unto Moses and Aaron. Because ye believed me not, to sanctify me in the eyes of the children of Israel, therefore ye shall not bring this congregation into the land which I have given them." (Numbers 20:10-13) Many acts of disobedience are recorded in these few verses. Some emphasize one and some another. God summed them all up in the one statement, "You did not sanctify me in the presence of the people." God was left out. Moses said, "Shall we fetch you water." God said he was an unbeliever because of his rebellion. Neither Moses nor Aaron entered the land of Promise because of this unbelief.

"What? Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost which is in you, which ye have of God, and ye are not your own? For ye are bought with a price; therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's." (I Corinthians 6:19-20) Concerning his people Isaiah said God created them "for his glory" (Isaiah 43:7) It seemed a matter over which to be amazed, to the apostle Paul, that anyone would fail to see that he should use himself for the glory of God. Both body and spirit are His. They are His because he bought them. He has not let them out to anyone else, therefore His glory should be the first works of both body and spirit. When we fail to glorify God with our bodies and spirits, we prove ourselves to be the same unbelievers as were Moses and Aaron. Certainly if this kind of unbelief kept them out of the promised land, you and I cannot

expect to enter heaven with our hearts filled with the same attitude.

It is easy to see why God would refer to one as an unbeliever who refused to sanctify him in the presence of others, or refuses to use himself for God's glory. The person who believes that he or she can take time that should be given to the worship or service of God and use that time in making a living or seeking some form of recreation does not believe (Matthew 6:25-34). The person who believes they are justified in laying up treasures, while they refuse to be liberal with God, does not believe Matthew 6:19 and I Timothy 6:17. Those who think it is all right to miss worship in order to go visiting or to do anything other than worship God, do not believe Hebrews 10:25. You can go on from here. When we refuse to do anything that God wants his sons and daughters to do, we refuse to sanctify him in the presence of others, and rob him of the service of the person for whom he paid a great price. Would you be willing to employ a man or woman to work for you, and after they spend the day working for someone else pay them for their services? The things that you purchase for your own use, automobiles, homes, clothes, etc., are you satisfied for just anyone to use them? The answer is an obvious no. No more is God satisfied when the person he bought employs themselves with the affairs of others instead of the

Growing In Christ

One of the great themes of the New Testament is the concept of individual spiritual growth. When Paul wrote the letter to the church in Corinth, it was a congregation beset with problems. There was a party spirit and the church was divided into factions. In chapter 3 he tells them he cannot write unto them as being spiritual because they are carnal. They are still babies spiritually. They have been fed with milk and not with meat because they cannot handle meat.

The Hebrew Christians are told in chapter 5 that they have reached the point they should be teachers. Yet, they haven't grown and need someone to teach them the first principles again. He says they have need of milk and not of strong meat. They are babies.

Peter comes along in I Peter chapter 2 and tells his readers to lay aside malice, guile, hypocrisies, envy and evil speaking. Instead, they are to desire the sincere milk of the word that they might grow spiritually.

Yet, that was Peter's first letter. In the second letter, as he brings it to a close there is a further instruction on growth. In chapter 3 and verse 18 he writes, "go on growing in grace" (Moffat). Now think about those words. There are a lot of people who are born again but never seem to progress much further than infancy. The reason is, that they soon learn to be a "spiritual couch potato".

You see, growing in Christ means hard work, commitment and dedication. Are you up to the task?
