No one ever intends to become a drunkard. No drunkard can enter the kingdom of heaven. The bible is plain on that subject. Certainly, no one in their right mind would want to make of themselves someone who could not go to heaven. However, there is a difference in having a sociable can of beer and becoming a drunkard folks say, so they take a

drink or two. You see, they are only intending to be sociable. Their friends want them to do it and they see no harm in a little drink now and then. But, drinking will grow on you. Usually one drink will call for another. That is the way drunkards are made. No person intends to make a drunkard out of themselves, but many do it because they cannot see the end from the beginning and will not listen to those who have gone that way.

Then there is that individual who never intended to become a gambler. They had no intention of losing everything they had. It all started with that harmless scratch-off lottery ticket. Then they wanted to make a little bet on the horses. The bet was made and they won a little at the beginning. They, they realized the boats would be a great place to go and rationalized that if they viewed it as entertainment and spent no more than they would to see a ball game, there surely could be no harm in it. Yet, after they won a little, they began to lose. They doubled their bets to try and overcome their losses so they could get even and quit. Unfortunately, that time never came and they lost all they had, their home, their business and family.

When will men and women learn that they cannot mock God? "Be not deceived, God is not mocked, whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." (Galatians 6:7)

Complying With Our Demands

Are you willing to comply with the same demands that you make on other people? This should be a searching question for every member of the church to answer honestly in his own heart. Most of us have demands which we make of other people, at least in our own minds this is true. Our attitudes and our actions tell of those demands, and also whether or not we are willing to comply with them.

We doubt that any sincere member of the church would approve the discontinuance of Bible Study on Sunday morning. You would not approve an end to Bible Classes, would you? But Bible classes are not successful unless they are attended by someone, therefore, you in your own mind make a demand that somebody attend Bible classes which you demand to be held. Are you willing to comply with your own demands? Do you attend Bible Study classes?

For the church to do the work required, a rather large amount of money is necessary. You would not be in favor of pie suppers, or rummage sales, or lotteries to raise money for the church. Hence, in your own mind you demand that contributions be made for the church. Somebody must make those contributions, and so that is included in your demand. Are you willing to comply with the demands you make of other members of the church? Do you give as prospered?

Members of the church should be friendly. Friendly with strangers as well as with one another. But are you friendly? Visiting should be done. Sometimes people demand that others visit them, yet they refuse to visit anyone. They are not willing to measure up to the standard which they set up for other people. They are not willing to comply with the same demands they make on others. Jesus warned his disciples against the Pharisees because they taught and they did not act.
