William Wordsworth is considered by many to be the most important English romantic poet. One of the long poems that Wordsworth wrote during his long and illustrious career was titled, *The Excursion*, written in 1814. This long poem discussed virtue, education and religious faith. Hidden among the lines of this poem are these words, "A man he seems of cheerful yesterdays and confident tomorrows." There is much in that statement that is worthy of our consideration.

They can say that the one who has brought them to this point will keep them through all their journey. These people have a right to look with confidence on tomorrow, for the hand that knows how to guide men is holding their hand as they march through life. There may be those who say, "I have no cheerful yesterdays, what shall I do?" One need not continue through life without them. You see, right now, today, you can begin to store up cheerful yesterdays for tomorrow. Just because some mistakes have been made in life does not mean that the whole of life need be a mistake. At the present, looking back may hold no ray of sunshine for you at all, but tomorrow you will be looking back on today.

What are you doing with today? Have you ever heard the expression, "Today is the tomorrow you dreamed about yesterday"? We must live today! It is possible that all the sons and daughters of God can have both cheerful yesterdays and confident tomorrows.
