

Believing In Ourselves

In John chapter 10, Jesus is telling us that he is the Good Shepherd. In the middle of that lesson, he says that He has come that we might have life and have it more abundantly. If we are going to live life abundantly, we must believe in God, but we must also believe in ourselves.

In our world there are so many who are filled with self-doubt. But Jesus wants us to believe in ourselves. Often you find Jesus expressing belief in those he met. One day a sinful woman stood in the presence of Jesus. She had been brought there for condemnation. He spoke words of encouragement to her, not condemnation. He said, "Neither do I condemn thee; go, and sin no more." You can read the story in John chapter 8. Jesus said, "No matter what your past has been, I still believe in you."

Reading the gospels, we are impressed by Jesus' belief in people. We come away impressed with his willingness to trust them.. Over and over He lifted people to a new sense of self-respect. He raised them to new heights of believing in themselves. Remember, Jesus told that worried Father that all things are possible to him that believes. That truth applies to any person in any situation. William James is recognized as the father of American psychology. He put it this way: *"In any project the one important factor is your belief. Without belief there can be no successful outcome. That is fundamental."*

We must visualize ourselves as succeeding. Do you believe in yourself? If not, then you have a serious handicap to overcome. However, you can learn to believe in yourself. Create a mental picture of yourself as succeeding. There is an old story of an outcast beggar. He was sitting across the street from an artist's studio. The artist saw him and quickly began to paint his portrait. When he finished, he called the beggar over to look at it. The beggar at first did not recognize himself. He kept asking who it was and the artist just smiled. He kept looking at the portrait. At last, recognition began to dawn. He asked, "Is that me, can it be me?" The artist replied, that is the man I see in you." Then the beggar made a wonderful reply, "if that is the man you see, that is the man I will be."

Sooner or later, we become the person we see ourselves to be. If you develop faith in yourself, eventually your faith will recreate you. If your mind is obsessed by thoughts of insecurity and inadequacy, it is because you have allowed these thoughts to dominate your thinking over a period of time.

You must be willing to be yourself. One of the quickest ways to depreciate yourself is to become awestruck by other people and try to copy them. We can be ourselves better than we can be anybody else. When we try and be somebody else, we end up frustrated and defeated. Within each of us is a finer person waiting to be set free. You and I do not need to be someone else. We just need to be all that God made us to be.

We must have a right relationship with God. This is the most important part of living the abundant life and believing in ourselves. An English scientist once said that everywhere in England, deep within the soil were the seeds of tropical plants. He said they had laid there dormant for years. They were waiting for just one thing, the proper climate.

When we come into a right relationship with God, then we flourish, blossom and grow. Remember what Paul said in Philippians 4:13? He wrote, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me". Repeat those words over and over. Let those words become fixed in your mind. Let them be so fixed that doubts and fears are driven out.

There is another passage from Paul to remember. This is in Romans 8:31. He wrote there, "If God be for us, who can be against us". Nothing can defeat us when God is within us. Believe in God. Believe in yourself. Then, life can be abundant.

A settin' hen is miserable. She goes around with her feathers ruffled. Her disposition is reflected by her grumpy "cluck-cluck". She doesn't want to be bothered. She just sets all day long. Unproductive Christians are also miserable. To them, service is a duty, and going to worship is drudgery. Their unhappiness is reflected in their complaining. Their misery is shown in their excuses. Too often they don't know that the cause of their misery is their own lack of productivity. They are doing so little that they have lost their enthusiasm for the work.

Have you found Christian service a burden? Don't lay the blame on others, but take a look at yourself. The joy of service is only for those who are serving. The joy of Bible Study and Worship is for those who attend and help in those activities.
