Faith Is The Victory!

Immediately you recognize this as the title of one of those familiar hymns we have sung all of our lives. It was first published in 1891 in the *Christian Endeavor Hymnal*. The familiar words of the chorus ring out loudly Faith is the victory, the glorious victory that overcomes the world.

Faith is a common denominator in all of our lives. On a daily basis, every person living on the top side of God's green earth expresses faith in something. In fact, we cannot live a single day without exercising faith.

We have faith in the physical world. When you awoke this morning and went into the bathroom, you flipped a light switch and you had faith that it would work. When you get in your car, you have faith that it will start. When you mail a letter, you have faith that the postal system will get it to the right address (that's real faith!). When you go to the pharmacy, you have faith that the pharmacist will give you the right medication. Every time you walk into a building, you are expressing faith in the architect who designed the building and the workers who built the structure. Every time you walk into an elevator in a high rise building, you are expressing faith in the low bidder on the construction project.

In his first epistle, John writes of victory in overcoming the world. The world to which he refers are those things in the world, those things that would separate us from God. He in fact lists them in I John 2:15-17 as the lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye and the pride of life. The same ways Eve was tempted and Jesus was tempted.

These three things can be summarized in one word. Sin. There are however other things that hinder our relationship with God. Things such as anxiety, boredom, depression and despair. There are

also things such as discontentment, fear, grief and loneliness. Yet, no matter what might hinder our relationship with God, there is a remedy and there can be victory. This victory comes to those who believe Jesus is the Son of God. You see, faith is the victory.

Generally speaking, what is faith? It is the persuasion of the mind that a certain statement is true. It carries with it the primary idea of trust. It is a strong conviction or trust in something.

Our faith does not develop merely through intellectual assent to biblical dogma or through wishful thinking. Rather, it is a lifetime commitment to the person of Christ with a response of obedience to His Word. Our faith in Jesus is a strong conviction of trust in Jesus. We trust who Jesus is, we trust He is what He claimed, we trust that He is truly the son of the Living God.

Faith is also the strong belief in what Jesus did and is doing. It is the belief that He died on the cross. It is the belief that his death is a sufficient sacrifice. It is the belief that He intercedes for us in heaven.

This faith is a constantly developing aspect of our lives as Christians. Faith, you see, comes from evidence. Our faith is not just a "blind faith". There are often solid reasons for believing in what you


MEN'S BUSINESS MEETING – This morning immediately following the morning worship in the church offices. All men of the congregation are encouraged to attend.
