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A Letter to The Congregation of Israel

(With our present series on "The Misunderstood Church", we felt this might be a timely article. It is a fictitious letter that might have been sent out by Nadab and Abihu had they done things the way they are done in our day and time.)

has alienated us from everyone else. We believe this change will open new fellowship opportunities.
