Paul here emphasizes the need for our lives to be totally committed, totally devoted to the Lord and to His service. How committed are we – really? How important is the Lord to us? How important is the Church to us?

Jesus calls on us in the Sermon on the Mount to be the light of the world. To shine forth his love to a world that is dark and lost in sin. Jesus also calls on us to be the salt of the earth. Salt both seasons and it preserves. As God's people, we are to provide the seasoning for life to those around us and we are to be the preserving force for good.

However, we cannot be the light of the world and the salt of the earth with a half-hearted commitment. We must realize, to use a time worn old cliché, our life may be the only Bible our neighbor ever reads. When our friends, neighbors and family members look at our life, what do they see? Do we show our friends and loved ones, those we are trying to lead to Christ that the Lord and the Church are important in our lives? When you are tempted to forsake the assembly, when your commitment to the church is not what it should be, remember that Jesus shed His blood to purchase the Church. How much value to you place on the church"

Across The Preacher's Desk

As tropical storm Idalia strengthened to hurricane status earlier this week, evacuation orders were issued in some areas in anticipation of the storm making landfall. When storms hear about evacuations, it causes me to think of an incident in the life of Jesus when he was in a little boat with his disciples on Galilee. We read in Mark chapter 4 that a great storm of wind arose on the Sea of Galilee, the waves were beating into the ship and the disciples were afraid. Yet, in the midst of that horrific storm, Jesus was asleep in the back of the ship.

The storm with all of its fury could not wake Jesus up, yet, the fearful cry of His disciples woke Him. They asked Him if it mattered to Him whether they died or not. When they woke Him up, Mark tells us that Jesus rebuked the wind and said unto the sea, "Peace, be still". We are told that the wind ceased and there was a great calm. (Mark 4:39)

It was then that Jesus asked them, "Why are ye so fearful? How is it that ye have no faith?". Let's face it, storms are going to come in our lives. Storms of doubt, fear, temptation, sickness and disease. Storms that threaten us with loss of health or loss of wealth. Whatever storm is blowing in our life, Jesus can calm that storm if we will make Him the Lord and master of our lives.
