MUSINGS ABOUT THE BIBLE

My grandmother used to ask me, "what are you studyin' about?" As a small boy I was often puzzled as to what she meant. Then one day I came to understand what she meant. It was a colloquialism asking what was on my mind. It was usually asked when I was in a far off land, in my own little world with a little boy's dreams.

Have you ever thought about what the bible has for us, what it contains for us? Within the pages of the Bible we find the way to true happiness in Psalm 1:1-3. The Psalmist tells us the truly blessed person delights in the Law of the Lord. He meditates on it day and night and thus flourishes like a fruitful tree.

Again, in the 19th Psalm and verses 7 through 11, we find that the Bible is a book of many virtues. It is perfect, converting the soul. It is sure, making wise the simple and right, rejoicing the heart. The Bible is pure, enlightening the eyes and clean, enduring forever.

The Bible guards against sin, for we read in Psalm 119:11, "Thy word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against thee". If we are willing to hide the word of God in our hearts, the Bible can help us to avoid sin.

Furthermore, according to Psalm 119:97-100, the Bible makes us wise. Here is how that passage reads, "O how love I thy law! it is my meditation all the day. Thou through thy commandments hast made me wiser than mine enemies: for they are ever with me. I have more understanding than all my teachers: for thy testimonies are my meditation. I understand more than the ancients, because I keep thy precepts." Yet, in order for the Bible to make us wise, we must be willing to meditate on its commandments. Doing so will make us wiser than our enemies, our teachers and the wisest of history. But, we must be willing to

keep the precepts of the Bible. In that same 119th Psalm and verse 105 we are told that the Bible is a lamp to our feet and a light to our pathway.

The Bible is also a source of comfort and hope for us according to Romans 15:4. There Paul writes, "For whatsoever things were written aforetime were written for our learning, that we through patience and comfort of the scriptures might have hope.".

The things of the Old Testament are for our learning. They also give us comfort and hope. The Bible is living and powerful according to Hebrews 4:12. Then, again Paul writes in II Timothy 3:16-17 and we learn that the Bible is inspired by God and is profitable for doctrine, reproof, correction and instruction in righteousness. In fact, Paul tells us the Bible thoroughly furnishes us for every good work.

Throughout the centuries, great men have praised the Bible, the word of God. Patrick Henry, the American Patriot who became known for declaring "give me liberty or give me death" said, "the Bible is worth more than all other books which have ever been printed". The great writer of literature, Charles Dickens said, "the New Testament is the very best book that ever was or will be known in the world". One of our greatest presidents, Abraham Lincoln said, "I believe the Bible is the best gift God has given to man. All the good from the Savior of the world is communicated to us through this book".

Have I Yielded To The Lord?

"For whosoever shall keep the whole law, and yet offend in one point, he is guilty of all. For he that said, Do not commit adultery, said also, Do not kill. Now if thou commit not adultery, yet if thou kill thou art become a transgressor of the law." (James 2:10-11)

One must yield himself entirely to God. To yield at one point but to refuse to yield at another is to defy God and to reject his authority. One yet lacks the spirit of submission who refuses to yield completely.

If one rejects God's word on any one point he is guilty of rebellion against God no matter how obedient he may be otherwise. This is a general principle. One guilty of murder is guilty. He is not excused because he has been a kind father and honest neighbor. Good conduct otherwise will not offset disobedience and neglect. Kindness to neighbors will not offset unfaithfulness in worship. One has no right to expect God to overlook one area of rebellion because he has yielded to another.

One cannot be pleasing in the sight of God until he has come to put into practice the saying, "Speak, Lord, thy servant heareth; command and I will obey." -Just a Moment
