## The War of Ideas

There is a war that is never ending in this world. It is not fought on the earth's terrain but rather in the minds of people. It is the war of ideas, and its combatants are all those who attempt to exert influence, including parents, teachers, preachers, reporters, politicians, and Youtubers. The war's objective is to capture as many minds as possible. Call it "World War Zero," for it has been going on since man was in Eden.

Christians are soldiers in this war enrolled by Jesus into His army. When we committed ourselves to Him, He raised us up with Him and placed us in the heavenly places, i.e., the spiritual field of battle (Eph. 2:6). He also equipped us to win with the armor of God and the all-important weapon, the "sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God" (Eph. 6:13-17).

On the other side are the devil and his army, the "world forces of this darkness...the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places" (Eph. 6:11-12). They also are equipped with formidable weapons, which are captivating ideas, "philosophy and empty deception, according to the tradition of men, according to the elementary principles of the world, rather than according to Christ" (Col. 2:8).

To successfully fight each battle, we must neutralize the enemy's influence. It is not a matter of merely restraining ungodly behaviors. Minds must be changed for genuine repentance to take place. So then, each battle is won by "destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and...taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ" (2Cor. 10:5). This means we must expose the lies of Satan embedded in the wisdom of men such as Charles Darwin, Karl Marx, Friedrich Nietzsche, and Sigmund Freud. We must turn minds away from the world and toward God.

Battles are won in this war one soul at a time. Our orders are to go to each soul and reason from the gospel (Matt. 28:18-20; Mark 16:15-16). In this, we are combatants but not combative, gently "correcting those who are in opposition, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth, and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, having been held captive by him to do his will" (2Tim. 2:25-26).

These battles are not won easily. Even if the enemy's ideas are irrational and indefensible, he can still win. Satan is a master deceiver and has been so from the beginning (John 8:44; 2Cor. 11:3). He has other effective tactics as well. Silencing his opponents is one of his favorites. For example, when none of his minions could cope with Stephen's wisdom, they silenced him by murder (Acts

6:10; 7:57-60). On another occasion when their ideas were indefensible, they simply shouted, "Great is Artemis of the Ephesians!" for two hours as if that would make the lie become true (Acts 19:34). Today, these tactics are used in the forms of censorship, propaganda, intimidation, and cancel culture. One of the most insidious ploys now used by Satan's soldiers is to take away reason and replace it with experience. In this way, one's feelings are elevated above evidence. Someone who has been thus inoculated against logic is difficult to reach with the gospel.

Therefore, we must resolve to "fight the good fight of faith" (1Tim. 6:12) with all the strength God supplies. Faith comes by hearing the word of Christ (Rom. 10:17), so let it be heard. Souls are won only by transforming them through the renewing of their minds (Rom. 12:2). Fight then with the sword of the Spirit and win those minds for Christ. Have all confidence, knowing that Jesus has already defeated Satan and the outcome is certain (Heb. 2:14-15; Rev. 20:10). Soldiers of Christ, arise!
