TWO GARDENS

As the planting season is in full swing and we look forward to enjoying the fruit and the sustenance that will come from the labors of planting and watering, it brings to mind two gardens mentioned in the Bible.

The first garden is found in the opening pages of Genesis. It was the home of the first couple, Adam and Eve. It was fertile, fruitful, and mankind had access to the tree of life. Adam and Even enjoyed their labor in the garden and their relationship to their Maker.

But the beauty of that garden was destroyed by sin. The giving in to temptation brought sin and death and destruction to that beautiful place. Mankind no longer enjoyed the beautiful relationship to the Creator. The ground became cursed. Thorns and thistles appeared. And the labor became sweaty toil to produce the sustenance needed for life.

The second garden is found in the pages of the four gospels. Probably a lovely place in ordinary moments, but as we read of it in the gospel accounts, it was a place of struggle. It was in this garden, Gethsemane, where Jesus struggled mightily in prayer before His arrest, trial, and crucifixion. Luke describes the struggle: "And being in agony, He prayed more earnestly. Then His sweat became like great drops of blood falling to the ground" - Luke 22:44. His prayer was simple, "Not my will but Thine be done," but the struggle to accept and obey was monumental.

But the struggle that ended in the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus undid all the destruction of sin. The Savior's resurrection is God's testimony that access to life is now re-opened and that the relationship to God can be renewed. The garden story has a happy ending for those who will believe.
