In Luke 18, we are told a parable of two individuals with very different attitudes regarding themselves.

The first was a Pharisee who thought very highly of himself. As he prayed, he was thankful that he was not like other individuals who were sinners. Noticing the other gentleman, he specifically thanked God that he was not "like this tax collector."

The second individual, as we have already noted, was a tax collector. While he had a seemingly important job in regard to society, few liked tax collectors, for obvious reasons. However, he realized his lowly standing before God, and, as he prayed, he humbled himself before God, begging for His mercy.

Both men believed in God. Both men recognized the importance of petitioning Him with their needs. However, we are told that only one of them was right in what he prayed to God... And it wasn't the religious Pharisee.

What was the difference between the two? One was willing to humble himself before God, and regardless of his spiritual condition, God was willing to grant his request for forgiveness.

Regardless of the sin in our lives, God is willing to forgive us when we offer the proper attitude. When we are willing to repent and humble ourselves before Him, He is always willing to forgive.

"Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord, and He will lift you up." - James 4:10 (NKJV)

LAST WEEK'S QUESTION AND ANSWER

Which prophet boldly confronted David after he had his lover's husband killed?

ANSWER: (D) Nathan (2 Samuel 12:1-15)

Nathan approached King David with a parable. He said a rich man and a poor man lived in a city. The rich man had many sheep and livestock. In contrast, the poor man had only one little lamb. One day, the rich man stole the poor man's only lamb, and killed and prepared it for a meal to feed a visitor. David angrily bellowed, "The man who has done this deserves to die, and he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity." Nathan pointed at David and said, "Thou art the man! ... You have struck down Uriah the Hittite with the sword and have taken his wife to be your wife and have killed him with the sword of the Ammonites." Most Bible scholars agree David wrote Psalms 32, 51, and 86 after this event, in which he acknowledges his sins and repents.
