Kyle's Korner

CLEAN

The word, "clean," has various meanings applied to its use in Scripture. It is used to specify the type of sacrifices Israel was to offer – clean, pure, unblemished. In like manner, it is also used in reference to illness or impurity in man – leprosy, sin and other things that might make one impure – that they be not defiled in coming before God. Certain foods, especially meat, were to be "clean" before they could be eaten, if they could be eaten at all.

In reference to the wickedness of Judah (and probably one of the most recognizable passages), Isaiah tells God's people to: "Wash yourselves, make yourselves clean..." (Isaiah 1:16, NKJV). I think, from a literal standpoint, we understand the importance of good hygiene (if not for ourselves, for others). But Isaiah is not instructing them in regard to the physical body, but the inward, spiritual being. "...Put away the evil of your doings from before My eyes. Cease to do evil, Learn to do good..." (1:16-17). They had defiled themselves spiritually, and Isaiah teaches them the importance of being "clean" before God.

He goes on to say, "Though your sins are like scarlet, They shall be as white as snow; Though they are red like crimson, They shall be as wool" (1:18). But how is this accomplished? It's obvious he is not talking about taking a bath! What is offered Judah (and us, too) is forgiveness. This forgiveness actually looks forward to something (Someone) well into the future – the coming of Christ. Through His own sacrifice of blood and life, their (our) souls could be cleansed of impurity and sin. These people could, and should, be clean!

Jesus offered his life that we (you) can be clean. No matter how deep the stains of sin may be in your life... No matter how long those sins have been there... Jesus offered the ultimate sacrifice so that you can be clean, to be in His presence once again – now, and in eternity.
