# Trusting and Serving in Times of Weakness

In 1 Samuel 30, when David and his men return home after a raid, they are devastated to find their wives and children have been taken captive. In their overwhelming grief they look for someone to blame. Even though David's family has also been kidnapped, the men blame David and plan to stone him. In his anguish, David leaves us a godly example by choosing to "strengthen himself in the Lord his God" instead of blaming someone else or playing the victim. When David hits rock bottom, he goes to God with his problems. He has been on the run from Saul and unwelcome in his own home for years. Now the Philistines have rejected him, his family is missing, and his friends have turned against him. Despite all this, David makes a bold and profound choice—he seeks God's guidance and strength. In a moment of turmoil, he relies on God's direction instead of trying to figure things out on his own.

Once God directs David to pursue the kidnappers, a simple kindness shown to an Egyptian leads to the information needed to find the missing families. When some of the men were too exhausted to follow David, they stayed with the supplies, yet David made sure they were rewarded the same as those who fought and rescued the missing families.

What can we learn from this chapter? When problems overwhelm us and sadness smothers us, where do we find the will and the courage to continue? Do we seek to blame or hold someone else responsible for life's challenges, or do we go immediately to the Lord? Do we allow our own sadness to blind us to the needs of others? David found his courage in the Lord by going to Him immediately. Despite his own tragedy, he helped someone in need and through this kind action, the Lord helped David.

Like David, do we sure to honor everyone who serves the Lord in whatever way they can? Some folks reserve most honor for preachers or those in the public spotlight. Do we appreciate those who "stay with the baggage"? Ecclesiastes 3:1 says "There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens." This verse reminds us to serve God in every season of life, when we have the strength to pursue and also when life's exhaustion limits our service.

I encourage you today to ask God to remind you to go to Him when trouble arises and not to blame others. Try to text or call someone who, even in their old age or physical weakness, serves the Lord as best as they can.
