#### The Aims of Preaching/Manner of Preaching-Chapter 1......Concluding Observations

Our world is changing, and will continue to change. It has been changing ever since the Garden of Eden. Someone has said that when they were driven from the Garden, Eve turned to Adam and said, "The times, they are a changin'." How true! We must recognize the fact of an ever-changing world and not be intimidated by it. We cannot afford to retreat into a cocoon and refuse to accept the reality of change.

Change per se is not wrong. Some changes are wrong, but not all are. Changes (good and bad) in customs, life-styles, technologies, and values will continue to take place. Preachers would be wise to stay informed of the changes taking place in the world. Within the arenas of expediency and matters of human judgment and opinion, it is wise to be flexible and adaptable. The late H. A. Dixon used to frequently quote Alexander Pope, the English essayist, who said, "Be not the first by whom the new is tried, nor yet the last to lay the old aside." That is good advice for preachers today. All preachers of the gospel should be willing to say with Paul, "I have become all things to all men, that I may by all means save some" (I Corinthians 9:22 ASV). But in matters of faith and doctrine, we must "preach...the preaching that I (God) bid thee" (Jonah 3:2).

In summary the kind of preaching needed today is the kind Paul had in mind when he wrote, "I charge you therefore before God and the Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the living and the dead at His appearing and His kingdom: preach the word! Be instant in season, out of season. Convince, rebuke, exhort with all longsuffering and teaching" (II Timothy 4:1,2). If preachers will be faithful to this charge the church faces the future with great hope and optimism and with the promise that God Himself will give the increase. This is the kind of preaching needed today!

#### Chapter 2: "The Sermon On Pentecost.......

Acts 2 is the heart of the Bible. That is to say, everything before Acts 2 pointed to the events recorded in that chapter, and everything after Acts 2 points back to that landmark. At the heart of Acts 2 is the sermon preached by Peter and the other apostles of Christ. Such being the case, that sermon and what it sets forth constitutes the core of what the Bible is all about.

The sermon begins in verse 14 and reaches its crescendo in verse 36 with the irrefutable conclusion. "Therefore let all the house of Israel know assuredly, that God hath made this same Jesus, whom ye have crucified, both Lord and Christ." This affirmation is the central truth of God's plan for human redemption.. It is, therefore, the central truth of God's revelation to man.

An analysis of the sermon shows that it is divided into three parts:(1) a refutation of the charge that the apostles were drunk (verses 14,15); (2) a declaration that what was being seen and heard was the fulfillment of Old Testament prophecy (verse 16-21); (3) an affirmation that Jesus of Nazareth is Messiah and the savior of the world (verses 22-36). We shall now examine each part of the sermon in detail.. It is a brilliant, to say nothing of being an inspired, example of the kind of preaching needed today. Continued next week.
