Chapter 2: "The Sermon On Pentecost.......continued from Oct 15th bulletin

A Declaration of the Fulfillment of Prophecy: Verses 16-21 continued

Thus, the reference to the sun being turned into darkness before the coming of the great and notable day of the Lord may very well be hyperbolic language to describe the great changes in God's economy that are beginning to take place here on the day of Pentecost. Too we must recall that when Christ was crucified some fifty days before the Pentecost of Acts 2, "from the sixth hour there was darkness over all the land unto the ninth hour" (Matthew 27:45).

What is "that great and notable day of the Lord" referred to in verse 20? While some think it refers to the second coming of Christ and the final judgment, the context of the passages points to the memorable Pentecost of Acts 2. We must keep in mind that from "before the foundation of the world" (Ephesians 1"4), God had planned for humanity's redemption "according to the eternal purpose which He purposed in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Epheisnas 3:11). Throughout the Old Testament the prophets had spoken of this glorious plan. Of this salvation the prophets have inquired and searched diligently, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you, searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He (that is, the Spirit of Christ) testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow" (II Peter 1:10-11). This eternal purpose and plan of God came to fruition on the "great and notable day" of Pentecost when the gospel was set forth in its completeness, enabling "whosoever shall call on the name of the Lord" to be saved (verse 21). Paul, in Romans 10:14, quotes the same passage from Joel, affirming that "whoever calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved."

What does it mean to "call on the name of the Lord"? A study of the conversions in the book of Acts, beginning with the three thousand on the day of Pentecost, will reveal fully what one does to "call on the name of the Lord" and be saved. Let it be stressed that to "call on the name of the Lord" involves more than simply saying, "Lord, Lord." Please note: "whoever shall call on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (verse 21). But Jesus declared, "Not everyone that saith to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he that doeth the will of my Father which is in heaven" (Matthew 7:21). If all who who "call on the name of the Lord" will be saved, but not everyone who says, "Lord, Lord," will be saved, then the conclusion is irresistible that calling on the name of the Lord involves more than a verbal or mental calling out of the Lord's name! As Jesus clearly stated, those who enter the kingdom of heaven will be those who do the will of the Father who is in heaven. To "call on the name of the Lord" means to obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ (II Thessalonians 1:7-9). The book of Acts sets forth in careful detail exactly how that is done. Saul of Tarsus, for instance, in arising and being baptized to have his sins washed away, called on the name of the Lord (Acts 22:16).

An Affirmation that Jesus of Nazareth is the Messiah: Verses 22-36

Peter now proceeds to the heart of his sermon—the affirmation that Jesus of Nazareth is indeed the long awaited Messiah and the savior of all mankind. He proves the deity of Christ by emphasizing several truths about Christ.

First, he affirms that Jesus of Nazareth was a man approved of God. The New American Standard Version renders the word "approved" as "attested." A footnote in that version says "accredited." So Jesus of Nazareth had God's stamp of approval upon Him. Peter says that Jesus was approved "by miracles and wonders and signs which God did by Him' (verse 22). A miracle is a supernatural act, a wonder is the effect that the miracle had upon the observer, and a sign is that which the miracle indicates or proves.
